

# CDRAF 2022 Report to Royal College of Dentists of Canada September, 2023

The Canadian Dental Regulatory Authorities Federation (CDRAF) is pleased to present this update on activities during the past 12 months.

#### 1. <u>National Dental Specialty Examination (NDSE)</u>

In 2022, The National Dental Examining Board of Canada (NDEB) gave notice that it would not be able to continue administering the National Dental Specialty Examination (NDSE) but agreed to offer the 2023 examination.

The Royal College of Dentists (RCDC) and NDEB are working collaboratively to transfer the administration of the NDSE from NDEB to RCDC for 2024. The CDRAF has appointed 3 representatives to the RCDC National Dental Specialty Examination (NDSE) Committee.

#### 2. <u>National Dental Specialty Recognition</u>

The CDRAF Board reviewed an application from the Canadian Academy of Dental Anesthesia (CADA) for recognition of Dental Anaesthesia as a specialty of dentistry.

At its meeting in February 2023, the CDRAF Board determined that the application met the criteria and approved the application to recognize Dental Anaesthesia as a specialty of dentistry

Implementation of the new specialty will vary with each dental regulatory authority over a period of time. Faculties of Dentistry will determine whether to implement a training program. The RCDC and CDAC have been requested to develop the required examinations and standards.

#### 3. National Competency Standards for General Dentists

A working group comprised of one representative from each of the CDRAF, ACFD, CDAC and NDEB developed a draft framework that was widely circulated to stakeholders. A final draft is currently out for a second circulation for feedback and will be reviewed for approval by the CDRAF Board at a future

meeting. Following approval, the Commission on Dental Accreditation of Canada (CDAC) will be requested to include the document in its Accreditation Standards.

4. <u>Commission on Dental Accreditation of Canada (CDAC) Independence</u>
CDAC achieved independence as a not-for-profit organization in December
2022 and has established a new Board of Directors and governance structure.

There are ongoing discussions with CDAC on a proposed new funding model for regulators and stakeholders.

#### 5. CDRAF Strategic Plan

The CDRAF Board approved its strategic plan for 2023-2026, with seven strategic initiatives:

- Embrace and promote cultural safety, reconciliation and humility.
- Promote the development of regulatory policies, which support equity, diversity, inclusion and accessibility.
- Establish national entry-level competency standards for general dentists and dental specialists.
- Collaborate with the National Dental Examining Board of Canada and other stakeholders to ensure that the certification processes for graduates of accredited and non-accredited undergraduate dental programs are fair, reliable, valid, accessible and timely.
- Collaborate with stakeholders to ensure that the certification processes for graduates of accredited and non-accredited dental specialty programs are fair, reliable, valid, accessible and timely.
- Provide the regulatory requirements of Accreditation to the Commission on Dental Accreditation of Canada.
- Facilitate collaboration on regulatory responses to emerging trends and issues.

The CDRAF Board is kept apprised of progress on the initiatives at each Board meeting (August progress review attached).

## 6. <u>CDRAF Multi-Stakeholder Working Group to review Certification</u> Processes

As part of the Strategic Plan, the CDRAF Board identified the need to establish a multi-stakeholder collaborative working group to understand the efficacy of the Reciprocal Accreditation Agreements, the NDEB Equivalency Process and

Qualifying Programs and to explore potential changes to the established processes and additional pathways to certification and licensure.

The working group has held several meetings to learn more about the processes, including a two-day workshop with the NDEB.

In January 2023, ACFD submitted an application for funding to Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC). The application is for development, implementation and evaluation of a new pathway that would allow internationally trained dentists with knowledge and skills comparable to graduates from accredited dental programs the ability to access the certification process more efficiently.

ACFD recently received notice from ESDC that the application was successful and ACFD is now entering into a negotiation phase of the process.

#### 7. <u>Virtual Care Standard</u>

The CDRAF Board have discussed developing a Standard on Virtual Care that can be modified for each jurisdiction. Terms of Reference are being drafted for a working group.
